During one of the most challenging times in recent history, Julie Rice Blyman and I made the decision to found a nonprofit that would impact the literacy rate in our community. This was the hard part. Since that time we have faced many challenges, but none have been as frightening as that first decision.

2023 was an eventful year for Open Doors requiring us to dig deep and rely on the kindness and generosity of our community. A fire in the space adjacent to our office saw us starting from scratch in November. The damage done to the structure necessitated a move for our organization. We went from sharing space with another company at no cost, to paying rent and utilities. Fumes from the fire also damaged the majority of our materials and resources. A loss of over \$40,000.

January 2024 saw us settled in to our new location in the Lynchburg Building. We now have over 1,500 square feet of space to fill with literacy activities. We are excited for the future and hope that you will continue to offer your support and encouragement.

In November, we recieved the Chestertown Rotary Club's Titsworth Service Award on behalf of the organization.



In Office Tutoring


Tutors provided Orton Gillingham tutoring between the hours of 9:00 AM and 6:30 PM Monday - Friday.

- Students Pre-K through Adult were enrolled in this program.
- The majority of students improved at an above average rate as measured by benchmark testing using Acadience Reading.


Tutoring at Horizons

Tutors provided 1:1 and 2:1 Orton Gillingham tutoring to students at Horizons of Kent and Queen Anne's at the Kent School Site.

- Students in 1st 5th were enrolled in this program.
- Students were tested at the beginning and end of the program using the CORE Phonics Survey and all showed measurable gains in phonics skill level.

At Open Doors Partners in Education our mission is to increase the literacy rate of struggling readers by providing tutoring, offering educational enrichment opportunities, and increasing community awareness of learning differences in Kent County and its surrounding communities.





After the fumes from the fire forced us to destroy our collection of decodable books we were overwhelmed by the cost to replace these important materials. 
